



## Jail Reentry Program

At Coordinated Care, we believe in an equitable future where individuals receive whole-person care and access to wrap-around supports, disrupting the cycle of incarceration. Through the Jail Transitions Program and the Reentry Initiative under Washington's 1115 Medicaid Waiver\*, our mission is to proactively increase access to care and reduce recidivism for both our members and our communities.

- **What is reentry?** Reentry is the transitional period after an individual is released from being incarcerated from a state, federal, local, or tribal correctional facility.
- **What is recidivism?** Recidivism refers to a person's relapse into criminal behavior, often after the person receives sanctions or undergoes intervention for a previous crime.

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### WHO WE SERVE:

Our focused outreach targets all justice-involved members booked or being released from most correctional facilities within the state, including state, local, county, tribal, and juvenile facilities.

### OUR PARTNERS:

We partner with the Health Care Authority (HCA), Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC), Department of Corrections (DOC), and WA Department of Children, Youth, & Families (DCYF) to create tailored processes to help us identify members for outreach.

### WHAT WE OFFER:

Beginning July 1, 2025, the Reentry Initiative will provide essential, pre-release services for individuals leaving incarceration. Under this initiative, incarcerated individuals who are Apple Health-eligible will receive a set of services up to 90 days before their release. These services will ensure a person's health and successful reentry to their community.

### SERVICES PROVIDED:

- Reentry Targeted Case Management (rTCM)
- Medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD) and medications for alcohol use disorder (MAUD)
- Reentry Pharmacy: 30-day supply of medications and medical supplies at release
- Medications during the prerelease period
- Lab and radiology
- Services by community health workers with lived experience
- Physical and behavioral clinical consultations
